Excellence in Family and Small Business Award Winners Recognized

The University of Arkansas - Fort Smith Center for Economic Development celebrated ten family-owned and small businesses and individuals at Thursday's Excellence in Family and Small Business Awards at The Bakery District.

This year, the selection committee reviewed 110 submissions from across an eight-county region, spanning Arkansas and Oklahoma. Kendall Ross, associate vice chancellor for economic and workforce development, called the awards a way to celebrate the spirit and achievements of family-owned and small businesses.

Bill Hanna of Hanna Oil & Gas, last year's Legacy Champion Award winner, presented the 2025 award to this year's Legacy Champion, Sam T. Sicard, chairman of the board for First Bank Corp. and First National Bank of Fort Smith, and a fifth-generation banker in the River Valley.

"This is a great group of leaders and business leaders from our community," Sicard said. "I'm very honored that many people whom I respect have recognized me for this award. It's very humbling."

New this year was the announcement of the Jim Walcott Family Enterprise Center Distinguished Service and Commitment Award.

Fred Williams was honored as the first recipient, commemorating his 21 years of support and commitment to the success of the JWFEC, its members, and the community. The award stands alone as a selection by the JWFEC team. Ross said the award is reserved for those who have believed in the Center's vision and have given their time, energy, and wisdom to help shape it.
